Since it began two years ago, the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted education systems around the world. However, the “new normal” at which we have now has also produced unprecedented developments in online learning opportunities. During this difficult time, we have worked to retain our core values – encouraging students to develop knowledge, skills, positive values and attitudes towards sustainable living and nature conservation – while leveraging technologies and combining them with traditional learning approaches to deliver the desired learning outcomes.
