## MAI PO NATURE RESERVE, WETLAND, EXPLORE.

### PRIMARY SCHOOL EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Located in the northwest corner of Hong Kong, the Reserve lies at the heart of Hong Kong's only internationally-designated wetland. These wetland habitats support large number of waterbirds and allow migratory birds to rest and feed. As "nature's lifeline", these wetlands are vital to the lives of humans and other species. However, numerous human induced threats, especially urban development, are causing harm to coastal wetland habitats all around the world and here in Hong Kong. Come and learn in Mai Po Nature Reserve to explore more about our wetlands.
